The book group will discuss *Mennonite in a Little Black Dress* by Rhoda Janzen on Thursday, July 8 at 7 p.m. here at the bookstore.

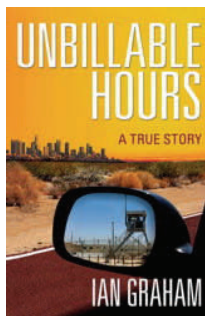
On Thursday, August 12, we will be discussing *South of Broad* by Pat Conroy.

But Graham also tells about the grueling life of a first year associate at a prestigious law firm where salaries are high but free time to spend it is rare.
